

The 12 session programme focuses on topics such as de-escalation, parental presence, reconciliation gestures, understanding parent trauma and child trauma.



Sessions are structured and take place over a 12 week period; the classes will be delivered in community building settings.

All of the sessions are led by facilitators from an Ethnic minority, African & Caribbean background; all sessions are aimed to be inclusive and culturally sensitive to the needs of parents.

A parent and carer's guide to keeping your children safe to and from school

As parents and carers, the safety of your children is your utmost priority; it's essential to be proactive about their safety during their journeys to and from school. Our staff do patrols after school in 4 different areas of the immediate community. However, are some practical steps you can take to ensure your child navigates London's streets safely.

1. Open Communication: The Foundation of Trust

Establish a relationship where your child feels comfortable discussing their daily experiences with you. Encourage open conversations about their commute, the people they meet, and how they feel while travelling. Understanding their routine helps you identify potential risks and address them together.

2. Plan the Route Together: Knowledge is Power

Familiarise yourself with the route your child takes to school. Discuss and plan alternative paths together, preferring well-lit, populated routes over shortcuts through less-travelled areas. Use this time to point out safe spots they can go to if they ever feel unsafe, like shops or cafés. All of the local shops to the school have the school's telephone number and have agreed to help our students if they need it.

3. Reinforce the Buddy System: Strength in Numbers

Encourage your child to walk with friends or classmates whenever possible. There's a significant safety boost when they are part of a group. Coordinate with other parents if needed to arrange for your child to walk together.

4. Tech as a Tool: Smart Safety Measures

Leverage technology for safety. Consider apps that allow your teen to share their location with you. Discuss the importance of keeping their phone charged and within reach but out of sight to avoid attracting undue attention.

5. Educate on Awareness: Precaution is Better than Cure

Teach your child the importance of being aware of their surroundings. Encourage them to avoid distractions like loud music or texting while walking. Discuss the importance of being observant and trusting their instincts if something doesn't feel right.

6. Role-play Scenarios: Preparation Meets Opportunity

Discuss potential scenarios they might encounter and role-play how to respond. For instance, how to react if approached by a stranger or what to do if they suspect they're being followed. This not only prepares them but also helps to keep them calm in the face of an unexpected situation.

7. Equip with Safety Gadgets: An Ounce of Prevention

Consider providing your teen with safety gadgets like a personal alarm, which can be used to draw attention in case of an emergency. Teach them the importance of having these items readily accessible.

8. Stay Informed: Community Awareness

Keep yourself informed about the safety of the neighbourhoods your child travels through. Be aware of any reports of crime in your area by following local news and community forums. Share relevant information with your child while ensuring it's done in a manner that informs rather than alarms.

Raising a teenager in London is an experience filled with excitement and challenges. While the city offers a multitude of opportunities for them to thrive, it's essential to be proactive in ensuring their safety. By taking these steps, you're not just protecting your child; you're empowering them with the confidence and skills they need to navigate their world safely. Remember, ensuring their safety is a collaborative effort between you and your child. Stay connected, stay informed, and support each other in making their journey through London a safe and enjoyable one.
