Curriculum Overview 2024 - 2025

Curriculum intent statement:

In Modern Languages our aim is to create a personalised curriculum in which pupils develop:

- their love of language learning
- an appreciation of other cultures

Students will build their linguistic knowledge and skills in an enriching and supportive environment. Through the study of grammar each child will learn how a language works, while music, film and ICT based learning will make for an enjoyable and engaging language learning experience. In turn, this will provide a platform for them to develop into able life long linguists and succeed in whatever they aspire to do.

The **KS4** course builds the foundations at KS3, continuing to develop listening (note taking), speaking (debating and presenting), reading (including skim and scan), writing(in a range of registers) and translation skills so that each student is able to converse and debate on a range of different themes and be able to partake in a work placement, student exchange or holiday in any Francophone/Spanish speaking country or continue to A level.
