This week's Values in Action Being on time and organised

Getting your child ready on time can be a daily challenge, but with some strategies and consistency, you can make the process smoother. Here are some tips to help:

- Create a Routine Establish a morning routine that includes all necessary tasks (e.g., brushing teeth, getting dressed, eating breakfast). Post it somewhere visible. Stick to the same order of tasks each day so it becomes a habit.
- **Prepare the Night Before** Layout uniform the night before to avoid morning decisions. Ensure backpacks, lunchboxes, and The Big 6 are all ready.
- Wake Up Earlier Give extra time: Allow a buffer for unexpected delays or slow mornings. Stagger wake-ups: If you have more than one child, consider waking them up at slightly different times to reduce chaos.
- Make It Fun Turn tasks into a game: Use challenges like "Can you get dressed before this song ends?". You could also include a reward system: Use stickers or small rewards for completing tasks on time.
- Teach Independence Encourage responsibility: Gradually let them take charge of parts of their routine. Practice skills: Spend time teaching how to button shirts, tie shoes, or pack their bag. With patience and consistency, your child can develop the skills to get ready on time, and mornings can become less stressful for everyone.




UNIFORM EXPECTATIONS
