

Words from Our Champion: Mawada Shire's Journey to Victory

From nerves to standing centre stage, Year 10 student Mawada Shire shares her journey to winning the Jack Petchey Regional Finals, reflecting on how the experience transformed her confidence and public speaking skills.



"Last year, I had the chance to watch Aleiya at the Grand Final. That moment inspired me - I knew I wanted to compete. But at the start, I wasn't sure I could. I was nervous, and I didn't enjoy being the centre of attention. I even considered dropping out."

"As the workshops began, something changed. I started speaking up, sharing my experiences, and slowly, my confidence grew. The biggest challenge was delivering assemblies to over 240 students—something I had never done before. The first one wasn't my best, but by the second and third, the nerves faded, and my words flowed naturally."

"By the time I reached the regional final, I felt ready. Watching my friends speak gave me courage, and when it was my turn, I strode onto the stage and made it my own. As they announced the results, I prepared for disappointment—3rd place... 2nd place... and then drumroll... 'MAWADA SHIRE!' My jaw hit the floor. I couldn't believe it."

"More than the trophy, I left that stage proud—not just of winning, but of the person I had become."

Reflecting on the achievement, Mawada expressed, "It's my birthday today, and it's the best birthday present ever. I am so happy I won."

This victory is a testament to Mawada's dedication and the supportive environment fostered by Mulberry Academy Woodside. Her story will no doubt inspire future students to take on new challenges and believe in their own potential.

Year 7 and 8 Students Experience the Magic of the West End



- A tour of the Williams museum, showcasing over 50 heritage cars and innovations in car development, from carbon fibre to tyre technology.


The students had a fantastic time, gaining valuable insight into the industry. A big thank you to Mr Hasan and Ms Ozcan for making this trip possible.

This week's Values in Action Encouraging students to use emotionally friendly language

How can you encourage emotionally friendly language at home?

- Model Emotional Language: Use clear, respectful emotional expressions yourself.
- Active Listening: Acknowledge and reflect on their feelings to show understanding.
- Validate Emotions: Let your child know their feelings are okay and normal. Reinforce
- **Positive Language**: Praise when they express themselves in healthy ways.
- Teach Empathy: Help your child understand others' emotions and perspectives.

Here are some examples of how you can model emotionally friendly language at home:

Scenario 1

Parent: "I'm feeling a little stressed because I have a lot of work today, but I'm going to take a break to feel better."

Child: (Hears parent express emotions in a calm, healthy way and starts doing the same.) Child: "I feel happy because I finished my homework!"

Scenario 2

Child: "I'm really upset that my friend didn't invite me to the party."

Parent: "It sounds like you're feeling hurt because you weren't invited. I can understand why that would be frustrating."

(This helps the child feel heard and understood, encouraging them to express their emotions more openly.)

Scenario 3

Child: "I'm really angry because my game broke!"

Parent: "I can see why you're upset. It's really frustrating when something we care about breaks. It's okay to feel angry about that."

(Validating the child's feelings helps them feel supported and more comfortable sharing their emotions.)



Communication from the Medical Rooms


