

RESET:to ensure students are prepared for the new term

Our Values after half term will focus on a reset to ensure students are prepared for the new term.

How can you support your child during half term to ensure they are ready to be successful when they return to school?

• Encourage a Balance of Relaxation and Revision

Help your child find a balance between relaxing and keeping their brain engaged. Set aside a small amount of time each day for light revision or reviewing notes, while also allowing plenty of time for rest and fun.

Maintain a Relaxed Routine

While it's important to let your child unwind, try to encourage a simple routine—regular sleep times and meals—so that they're not completely out of sync when school starts again. This will make the transition back easier.



Encourage Physical Activity

Suggest physical activities, whether it's a walk, a workout, or a sport. Staying active helps clear the mind, improve energy levels, and can prevent feelings of sluggishness or stress when returning to school.

Keep Schoolwork Light



Rather than pushing your child to complete large amounts of homework, encourage them to revisit what they've learned in a relaxed way. Watching educational videos, doing short quizzes, or talking through key topics can help keep them engaged without feeling like it's schoolwork.

Help Them Set Goals for the Next Term

Ask your child about what they'd like to achieve in the next term, whether it's improving their grades, preparing for exams, or getting involved in extra-curricular activities. Setting small goals can help them stay motivated and focused when school resumes.

This way, your child can relax during half-term but also feel ready and motivated to return to school!


