## DEAR PARENTS AND CARERS,

Welcome back to the spring term. I hope all our families and young people had a restful break.

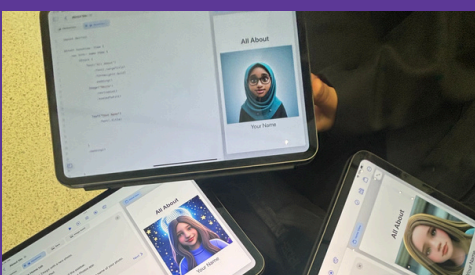

#### •YOUR POSTER MUST BE:

1. **Creativity in approach** – You might have a brandnew idea, or you might come up with something that already exists but re-imagined in a unique or creative way.
2. **Scientific content** – Your ideas should be clear, accurate and in line with your level of learning.
3. **Research content** – You might carry out some research first, to inform your thinking, and this should be reflected in your entry.
4. **Viability** – Could your idea work? Can you explain how? Show or explain how it would change the air in your chosen space and make it healthier!
5. **Presentation and effective communication** – Aim to present your idea in a way that is clear, logical and easy to understand. Think about the way you set out your ideas and the use of text and images. You could create a poster, a set of instructions or a diagram – think about the best way to showcase your thinking!

Entries must be one page of A4 or A3 paper only and you will need to take a photo or scan of it to send electronically.

Work must be original and created by the student(s) - please do not use any templates.

- Entries will be open to young people aged 11-14, 14-16 (Ash, Birch, Cedar, and Willow).
- Submit your poster to Dr Hasan in the Science Department BY FRIDAY 14TH MARCH 2025.

The poster will be judged by a panel of judges in School.

- 25 praise points for each valid entry.
- 50 Praise points for the finalist.
- Amazon vouchers for each winner from each year group.

- The winning poster (s) will be submitted for the national competition
