- Year 11 Easter School – Monday 7th April to Friday 11th April

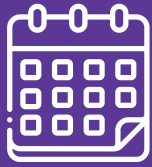

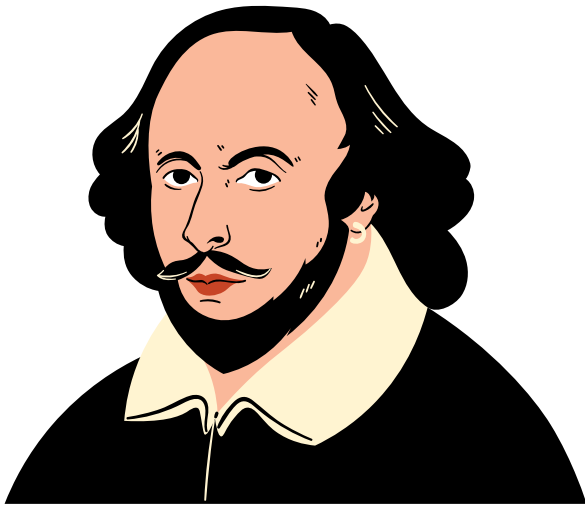

## Brave Macbeth! Year 10 Take on the Scottish Play

First performed before King James I in 1606, Macbeth—also known as The Scottish Play—follows Macbeth's tragic downfall as ambition, hubris and guilt lead him to murder King Duncan and face the devastating consequences.

In preparation for their trip to Shakespeare's Globe to watch The Tragedy of Macbeth, 10K/En2 took part in a lively and thought-provoking workshop with Shakespearean actor and facilitator, Tom. Setting up in the Library, Tom put Year 10 through their paces with drama warm-ups, paired snapshots of key moments and a praise 'corridor,' where students were hailed as 'brave Macbeth' after his victory over the Norwegians.

The session doubled as valuable revision, reinforcing character motivations, themes, and key quotes. Students explored manipulation, Jacobean gender roles and power by taking positions in the room to justify their views on Macbeth's decisions. Discussions and creative actions helped deepen understanding of the play's central ideas.

Year 10 showed resilience, confidence and humour throughout, engaging well with each other and the facilitator. Special shoutout to Levi, Ethan, Mihaela, Kimora, Mimuna, Noah, Jennifer, Melda, Antonia, Rayyan and Aaron for stepping out of their comfort zones with creative responses and mini performances.

Students loved the experience—some even wanted to continue exploring the play in the next period!

Huge thanks to the Site Team for rearranging the Library to make it all possible.



## Year 7's Green Thumb Adventure

On Wednesday, 45–50 Year 7 students took part in a horticultural workshop led by Eat Wood Green, part of the Black Rootz collective. Funded by Haringey Council, the project teaches food growing and sustainability while linking to core subjects. Students planted sunflowers, coriander, and mustard seeds, which they can bring back to the school garden once grown. The hands-on sessions explored the importance of sustainable growing and biodiversity. Students showed great enthusiasm and teamwork throughout. ## Kickstarting Change: Year 10 Girls at Wolves Training Ground

Last Friday, Havin and Diara, part of the PL Inspires group, attended the Premier League Changemakers Conference at the Wolverhampton Wanderers training ground. After an early 7:15 am train from London, they arrived to stunning facilities, with immaculate grass and artificial pitches – a true top-flight setup. The event was held on the indoor pitch, where they were greeted by the Premier League trophy, won last season by Man City.

The day was hosted by Amber Sandhu, a Sky Sports commentator and Wolves ambassador, who introduced a series of inspiring workshops themed around Accelerating Actions for International Women's Day. The workshops included 'Expression and Illustration,' where the girls explored the legacy they want to leave; 'Careers in and out of football,' which looked at alternative paths like broadcasting and coaching; 'Resilience and Leadership,' led by a FIFA assistant referee; and 'Youth Voice,' which explored increasing girls' engagement in football and challenging stereotypes.

A highlight of the day was meeting Wolves women's players, who paused training to chat with the girls and sign programmes. Havin and Diara left with valuable insights, boosted confidence, and a photo with the Premier League trophy – a fitting end to an unforgettable day.

Dance is open to new students from Thursday, 29th April in the dance studio until 4:30 pm – everyone is welcome!

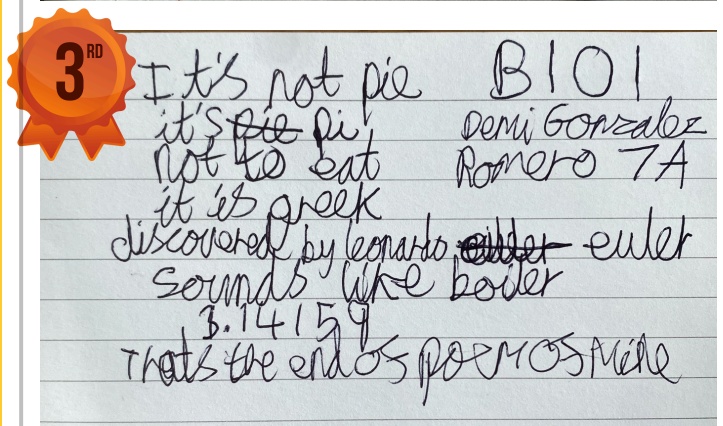
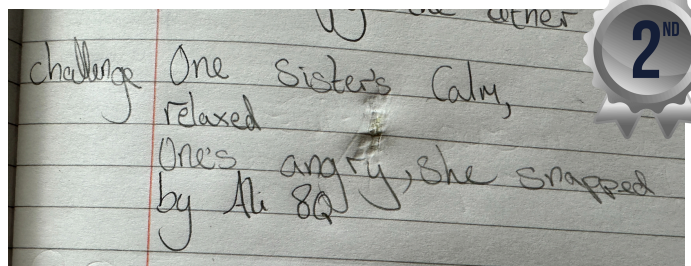
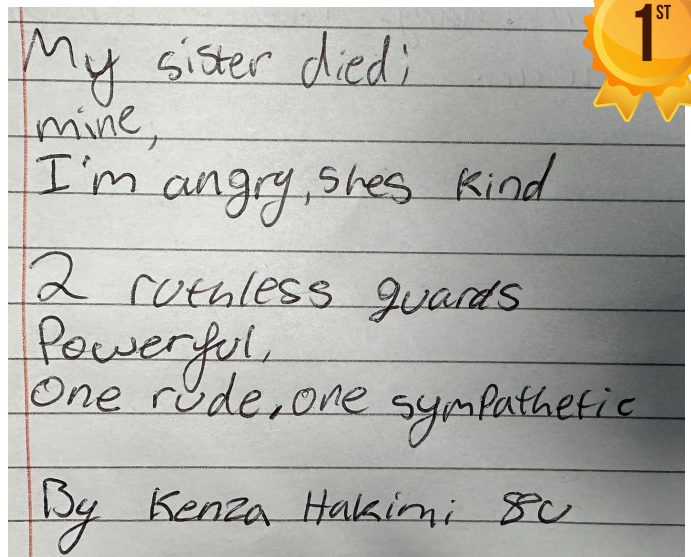

It is showed that some plants have the ability through their leaves, roots and associated micro-organisms the soil to reduce toxic concentration in the air.

The air we breathe is a complex mixture of gases and unfortunately human activities have increasingly introduced pollutants that can negatively impact our environment.



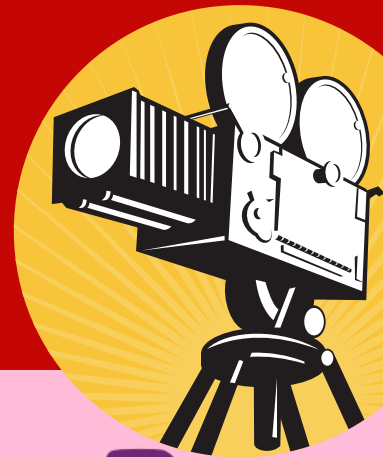

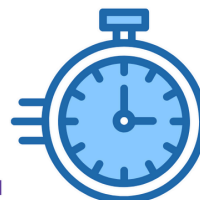
